The COVID-19 pandemic helped to reveal the benefits and value of telehealth as a tool to fill gaps in patient care. Audio and video telehealth reduces barriers to care such as transportation, child care, time off from work and in-person appointment availability. Since the onset of the pandemic, providers such as physical and occupational therapists, speech-language pathologists, and audiologists have utilized telehealth to maintain care continuation with patients that would traditionally see them only in an in-person setting. The value this flexibility has provided should be permanently extended through the passage of the Expanded Telehealth Access Act introduced by Representatives Sherrill (D-NJ) and Harshbarger (R-TN) as part of comprehensive telehealth legislation this year.

Hear from these providers and a patient advocate about the benefits of continuing this flexibility. The discussion will cover:
