AOTF Research Grants

Intervention Research Grant (IRG): The IRG provides seed funding for early-stage research studies to collect pilot data and build proof of concept to lay the necessary groundwork for larger intervention studies.

Health Services Research (HSR): HSR examines how people get access to health care, how and what care is delivered, the cost of care and patient outcomes. HSR is a multidisciplinary field that studies how social factors, financing systems organizational structures, health technologies and personal behaviors affect access to care, quality of car and the well-being of health-care consumers.

Implementation Research Grants (IR): IR focuses on helping occupational therapists take evidence-informed practice from theory to reality in their practice setting. This research grant develops and evaluates the processes used to implement, sustain, and or scale-up evidence-based practice into routine care with an end goal to improve the quality and effectiveness of care.

All of these grants occupy an important niche as they are one of the few opportunities OT researchers have to obtain financial support for new and novel ideas.

AOTF's Standing for Research Inclusion, Diversity, and Equity (STRIDE) committee offers research funds to occupational therapy (OT) graduates and clinicians to address the urgent need of broadening their representation in OT research.


Goal: This research fund will support their participation in a mentored research experience at an institution other than their own.

Scholarships for Future OT Scientists: Financial support for OTs enrolled in doctoral degree programs



The Lands Banks Memorial Scholarship

Lands Banks was the Manager of Administration and Facilities for the American Occupational Therapy Association for over 25 years.

Lands was an invaluable asset to AOTA, an instrumental fixture whose dedication and positive attitude created an enthusiastic and productive association that has impacted thousands of occupational therapy professionals. Sadly, Lands passed away in July 2023 and to honor his memory and his legacy a new scholarship has been established to provide financial aid to occupational therapy students.



The Lands Banks Memorial Scholarship in Occupational Therapy will provide a \$2,000 scholarship to a student enrolled in an AOTA accredited occupational therapy degree program.

Eligible candidates must be pursuing an entry-level degree, i.e., OTA, MOT, MSOT or OTD at a US institution, must be enrolled as a full-time student, and must have completed at least one year of coursework. In addition, candidates for this scholarship must demonstrate their role in community service and/or a service leadership role.

Preference for this scholarship will be given to students from historically under-represented minorities in the field of occupational therapy.
