Gender Expressed

- External expression of gender
- Social and cultural norms
- Grooming, clothing, voice, body characteristics
- Mannerisms
- Gender expressed is how someone expresses their gender on the outside.



Gender Identity

- Inner sense of one's self as masculine, feminine, combinations of both or beyond, or no gender
- One's personal sense of gender which may or may not correlate with their sex assigned at birth
- Gender Identity is internal feelings about one's gender.






Sex

- Anatomical, genetic, and biological characteristics that has usually been categorized as either female or male and is designated at birth
- Terms such as "male,"
 "intersex,", or "female" are
 typically used as reference to
 one's sex
- Sex is assigned at birth due to anatomical and biological characteristics.





Sexual Orientation

- Physical, emotional, and romantic attractions towards other people (i.e. straight, lesbian, bisexual, gay, asexual, etc.)
- Sexual orientation is attraction to other people.

It is important to know how these terms intersect and differ to use appropriate language with clients.
