Why This Matters

- Hospital readmissions have been associated with worsening prognosis, reduced quality of life, and increased mortality.
- Many hospital readmissions are avoidable.
- Occupational therapy interventions can be effective in reducing hospital readmissions for some patients admitted to hospitals for surgeries or with acute medical conditions.
- Some research shows that occupational therapy is the only service where additional spending results in lower readmission rates.
