## Section GG Medicare Functional Assessment

Use this form during your evaluation to help score and complete Section GG items. Section GG is a standardized functional assessment utilized across all post-acute care (PAC) settings by the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS). Although all of Section GG items are within the OT scope of practice, Section GG is intended as an interdisciplinary assessment. Other standardized assessments can and should be used in addition to Section GG during a comprehensive evaluation. AOTA encourages practitioners to utilize this data as an advocacy tool for the value of OT in PAC. These items correspond with Section GG items in Medicare PAC Assessments, including the Minimum Data Set (MDS), Inpatient Rehabilitation Facility Patient Assessment Instrument (IRF-PAI), Long Term Care Hospital Continuity Assessment Record Evaluation Tool (LTCH CARE), and the Outcome and Assessment Information Set (OASIS).

**Admission GG scores should reflect functional status prior to the benefit of services to capture the client’s true baseline.**

	Admission	Goal	Discharge	Item	Definition
A				<b>Eating</b>	The ability to use suitable utensils to bring food to the mouth and swallow food/ or liquid once the meal is placed before the patient.
B				<b>Oral hygiene</b>	The ability to use suitable items to clean teeth. Dentures (if applicable): The ability to insert and remove dentures into and from the mouth, and manage denture soaking and rinsing with use of equipment.
C				<b>Toileting hygiene</b>	The ability to maintain perineal hygiene, adjust clothing before and after voiding or having a bowel movement. If managing an ostomy, include wiping the opening but not managing equipment.
D				<b>Wash upper body**</b>	The ability to wash, rinse, and dry the face, hands, chest, and arms while sitting in a chair or bed.
E				<b>Shower/bathe self*</b>	The ability to bathe self, including washing, rinsing, and drying self (excludes washing of back and hair). Does not include transferring in/out of tub/shower.
F				<b>Upper body dressing*</b>	The ability to dress and undress above the waist; including fasteners, if applicable.
G				<b>Lower body dressing</b>	The ability to dress and undress below the waist, including fasteners; does not include footwear.
H				<b>Putting on/ taking off footwear</b>	The ability to put on and take off socks and shoes or other footwear that is appropriate for safe mobility; including fasteners, if applicable.
I				<b>Personal hygiene +</b>	The ability to maintain personal hygiene, including combing hair, shaving, applying makeup, washing/drying face and hands (excludes baths, showers, and oral hygiene).

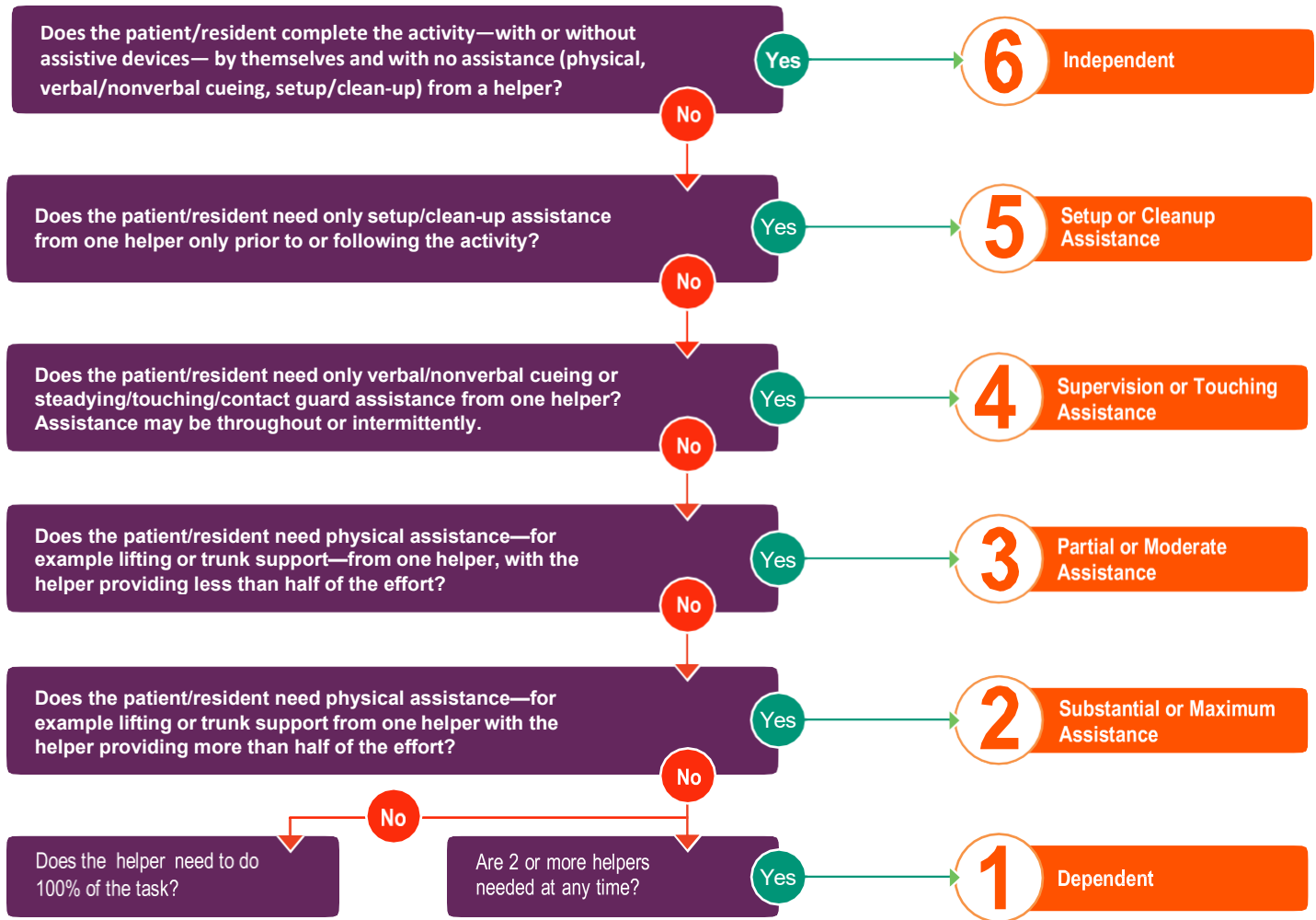

	Admission	Goal	Discharge	Item	Definition
A				<b>Roll left and right</b>	The ability to roll from lying on back to left and right side, and return to lying on back on the bed.
B				<b>Sit to lying</b>	The ability to move from sitting on side of bed to lying flat on the bed.
C				<b>Lying to sitting on side of bed</b>	The ability to safely move from lying on the back to sitting on the side of the bed with feet flat on the floor, and with no back support.
D				<b>Sit to stand</b>	The ability to safely come to a standing position from sitting in a chair or on the side of the bed.
E				<b>Chair/bed-to-chair transfer</b>	The ability to safely transfer to and from a bed to a chair (or wheelchair).
F				<b>Toilet transfer</b>	The ability to safely get on and off a toilet or commode.
FF				<b>Tub/ shower transfer *</b>	The ability to get in and out of a tub/shower
G				<b>Car transfer*</b>	The ability to transfer in and out of a car or van on the passenger side. Does not include the ability to open/close door or fasten seat belt.

I				<b>Walk 10 feet</b>	Once standing, the ability to walk at least 10 feet in a room, corridor, or similar space. If performance is coded 07, 09, 10, or 88, skip to M (1 step curb).
J				<b>Walk 50 feet with 2 turns</b>	Once standing, the ability to walk at least 50 feet and make two turns.
K				<b>Walk 150 feet*</b>	Once standing, the ability to walk at least 150 feet in a corridor or similar space.
L				<b>Walking 10 feet on uneven surfaces</b>	The ability to walk 10 feet on uneven or sloping surfaces (indoor or outdoor), such as turf or gravel.
M				<b>1 step (curb)*</b> <i>Can score if using wheelchair</i>	The ability to go up and down a curb and/or up and down one step. If performance is coded 07, 09, 10, or 88, skip to P (picking up object).
N				<b>4 steps*</b> <i>Can score if using wheelchair</i>	The ability to go up and down four steps with or without a rail. If performance is coded 07, 09, 10, or 88, skip to P (picking up object).
O				<b>12 steps*</b> <i>Can score if using wheelchair</i>	The ability to go up and down 12 steps with or without a rail.
P				<b>Picking up object*</b>	The ability to bend/stoop from a standing position to pick up a small object, such as a spoon, from the floor.
Q	<input type="checkbox"/> No	<input type="checkbox"/> Yes		<b>Does patient use wheelchair and/ or scooter?</b> Skip "R" and "S" if "No"	
R				<b>Wheel 50 feet with 2 turns</b> <input type="checkbox"/> manual <input type="checkbox"/> motorized	Once seated in wheelchair/scooter, can wheel at least 50 feet and make two turns.
S				<b>Wheel 150 feet</b> <input type="checkbox"/> manual <input type="checkbox"/> motorized	Once seated in wheelchair/scooter, can wheel at least 150 feet in a corridor or similar space

### Section GG Scoring Algorithm (CMS, n.d.)

Use the chart below to score each item. Adaptive equipment and assistive devices may be used for any score. For more information, see [aota.org/SectionGG](http://aota.org/SectionGG).



- 6: Independent**—Patient/resident safely completes the activity by themselves with no assistance from a helper.
- 5. Setup or Cleanup Assistance**—Helper sets up or cleans up; patient/resident completes activity. Helper assists only prior to or following the activity.
- 4. Supervision or Touching Assistance**—Helper provides verbal cues and/or touching/steadying and/or contact guard assistance as patient/resident completes activity. Assistance may be provided throughout the activity or intermittently.
- 3. Partial/Moderate Assistance**—Helper does less than half the effort. Helper lifts, holds, or supports trunk or limbs, but provides less than half the effort.
- 2. Substantial/Maximal Assistance**—Helper does MORE THAN HALF the effort. Helper lifts or holds trunk or limbs and provides more than half the effort
- 1. Dependent**—Helper does ALL the effort. Patient/resident does none of the effort to complete the activity. Or, the assistance of 2 or more helpers is required for the patient/resident to complete the activity.

- 07: Resident Refused**
- 09: Not Applicable**—Resident did not perform this activity prior to current injury, exacerbation, or injury.
- 10: Not Attempted**—Due to environmental limitations.
- 88: Not Attempted**—Due to medical condition and safety concerns.
